J.C. Hauserman gave a report on project activities at the airport.

Public hearing was held on the proposed ordinance relating to the Auburn Downtown and Courthouse Square District establishment of boundaries and significance of the historic district. It was noted that the Planning Commission has given their recommendation on the Auburn Historic local designation. Following the public hearing, Ordinance No. 10-14 relating to the Auburn Downtown and Courthouse Square Historic District was presented for consideration. The Mayor announced that the introduction of the proposed ordinance was in order.

ORDINANCE NO. 10-14

Auburn Downtown and Courthouse Square District (Boundaries and Significance)

Council Member Billings moved that these proceedings be kept in a separate and distinct volume known as the "Ordinance Record of the City of Auburn, Nemaha County, Nebraska", and that said volume be made part of these proceedings the same as though it were spread at large herein, which motion was seconded by Council Member Shawn Clark. Upon roll call vote, the following Council Members voted "YEA": Jeanneret, Billings, Shawn Clark, Tom Clark, and Janssen. The following voted "NAY": No one. Motion: Carried.

The City Council reviewed the bid tab on the proposed Longs Creek Trail project and the recommendation from JEO Consulting Group Inc. that the City accept the low bid of K-2 Construction. The bid will need to receive concurrence from the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission. Council Member Billings moved to award a contract to K-2 Construction in the amount of \$386,935.80 for the Longs Creek Trail Project, RTP-2014(001). The foregoing motion was seconded by Council Member Janssen and upon roll call vote, the following Council Members voted "YEA": Tom Clark, Janssen, Jeanneret, Billings, and Shawn Clark. The following voted "NAY": No one. Motion: Carried.

Council Member Billings moved to accept the recommendation of the Pension Plan Trustees and give approval for the City of Auburn, Nebraska and Board of Public Works Employee Pension Plan and Trust document to be reviewed by the pension attorney contingent upon approval of the Board of Public Works Board with the costs to be divided between the City and BPW per capita based on the number of participants in the plan. The foregoing motion was seconded by Council Member Tom Clark and upon roll call vote, the following Council Members voted "YEA": Janssen, Billings, Shawn Clark, and Tom Clark. The following voted "NAY": Jeanneret. Motion: Carried.

Council Member Janssen moved to approve the subsequent agreement to the interlocal agreement between the City of Auburn, the County of Nemaha and the Nemaha County Sheriff's office. The foregoing motion was seconded by Council Member Tom Clark and upon roll call vote, the following Council Members voted "YEA": Janssen, Jeanneret, Billings, Shawn Clark, and Tom Clark. The following voted "NAY": No one. Motion: Carried.

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It was noted that the Planning Commission has given their recommendation on the Auburn Historic local designation. Following the public hearing, Ordinance No. 10-14 relating to the Auburn Downtown and Courthouse Square Historic District was approved.

The City Council reviewed the bid tab on the proposed Longs Creek Trail project and the recommendation from JEO Consulting Group Inc. that the City accept the low bid of K-2 Construction.

With four Council Members (Janssen, Billings, Shawn Clark, and Tom Clark) voting in favor and one Council Member (Jeanneret) voting in opposition, approval was given for the City of Auburn, Nebraska and Board of Public Works Employee Pension Plan and Trust document to be reviewed by the pension attorney as recommended by the pension plan trustees contingent upon approval by the Board of Public Works Board and with the cost to be divided per capita by the number of employees participating in the plan.

The City Council approved the subsequent agreement to the interlocal agreement between the City of Auburn, the County of Nemaha and the Nemaha County Sheriff's office.
