The Brownville Concert Series will be hosting a Meet and Greet for Randy and Becky Jo of the New Christy Minstrels at Café Metro on Wednesday, April 20th. From 9:30 to 11am, enjoy coffee and snacks while Randy and Becky play some tunes on their guitars and tell you about their careers. Randy, who is 82 years old and still going strong, will share with you some great songs and stories about the New Christy Minstrels.

In Randy's own words, "I take very seriously the obligation to fill the seats wherever we work, and I'll make the effort to meet with folks in advance of our program there. I have much to talk about, and for younger people who don't know of our music and past success, it helps that Kenny Rogers came out of The NCM. I also gave John Denver his start and named him. Steve Martin became a comic on my stage; I had hired him as a banjo player.

Barry McGuire was my choice to replace me as front man, and I groomed him for the position. I wrote most of the music that we performed, and I won a Grammy for our first album. We played Carnegie Hall, and The Beatles in London wanted to meet The NCM, this is before their new brand of music effectively replaced us."

For local history buffs in Nemaha County and Southeast Nebraska, Randy wrote 'Joe the Juggler' about the wagons who traveled Steam Wagon Road in Nebraska City.

We hope you'll stop by Café Metro to join the festivities on April 20th. Also, be sure to check out the entire New Christy Minstrels ensemble in concert on April 22nd–24th at the Brownville Concert Hall.





Be Prepared for Extreme Weather

By the time severe weather hits, it's already too late to figure out what you're going to do. Disaster preparedness is about having an established safety plan which can become crucial in a severe weather situation. - Tornadoes can strike at any time. Most are abrupt and concealed by rain or darkness so remain vigilant and have a functioning weather radio in your home or business at all times. Have a shelter plan in place and make sure all family members and employees know where to go.
- The most dangerous place to be during a lightning storm is outside. If you hear thunder or see lightning, quickly move indoors or into a metal-topped vehicle and remain there until the storm has passed.
