This building, located at 917 Central Ave (also known as Hwy 36). It was built in 1900 and the façade still shows the decorative stone moulding of the time period on the second story of the building. The first story's façade was modernized during the 1960s.

This building shares walls with the buildings on both the east and west sides.

The front only features an entrance to the first story. There is a stairway in back of the building that leads to the apartments on the second story.

Since its construction in 1900, this building has been a part of the downtown business area of Auburn. For the last 113 years, several businesses have occupied the space and served the community of Auburn and the surrounding rural area.

Known businesses that have occupied this space include the Dustin Candy Kitchen (1930 through a least the 1950s) and The Waterhole tavern (1982).
